Amateurs to the rescue!

Amateur Radio Saves Family in Death Valley National Park - 04/12/2024 Death Valley National Park is in a remote desert in southern California, where mobile phone networks are spotty at best. On Saturday, April 6, a radio amateur and his family were enjoying the park when their vehicle became stuck in mud in a dangerous area. Without access to a cell network, the ham called for help on the 10-meter band.

According to a news release from the Black Swamp Amateur Radio Club, Caleb Gustwiller, KD8TGB, jumped into action.

Gustwiller was monitoring from Ohio when he picked up the distress call. He was able to hear the call sign and the general location of the ham in distress. He lost the signal to the noise, so he wrote a post in the Parks on the Air® Facebook group asking for other hams to listen for the calls.

CQ Publisher Dick Ross, K2MGA, SK

It is with great sadness that we report the passing on April 27 of Richard A. "Dick" Ross, K2MGA. He was 84. Dick was Publisher of CQ magazine since 1979, and was its editor in the 1960s. As President of CQ Communications, Inc., Dick was also publisher of multiple magazine titles, including Popular Communications, CQ VHF, CQ Contest, WorldRadio Online, Communications Quarterly, CB Radio, Electronic Servicing and Technology, Modern Electronics, MicroComputer Journal, and Music and Computer Educator. In addition, Dick oversaw the production and publication of CQ books and calendars, the CQ Video Library and more. In 2010, Dick received the Dayton Hamvention's Special Achievement Award.

He is survived by his wife, Cathy, daughters Kate and Jennifer, their husbands and five grandchildren. A memorial service will be scheduled at a future date.


Latest Update:

During August 3-9, 2024 look for Andreas DB8UX to be active from Botswana as A25UX. QRV on 40-10m using wire antenna; low power; FT8. QSL via LoTW.

JW - Svalbard

From 30th April to 4th May 2024, look for Helge LB4MI (previously JX/LB4MI) to be active from Svalbard. This will mainly be a POTA and SOTA activity; CW only. He will QRV with JW9DSA and JW5WUA. Some activity also from JW5E clubstation.

Helge writes:

As conditions at outdoor QTH's might change rapidly with regards to weather or other unexpected events, please expect some QRX or sudden QRT without announcements. We need to do shifts with icebear lookout during activations, using one operator. I will be operating split, starting 1 up and spreading 1-3 up depending on pileup. CW speed 16-17 WPM. QSL via Club Log, QRZ and LoTW.

3D2/c - Conway



Some info from the team: WX is not so good. Birds on the island are crazy and keep smashing into the verticals every hour. Waste of time using 80m = zero signals; 160 the same. 40m signals are weak. 10-30m very good. CW coming and some SSB. The ship is too far away from Conway and they are losing wifi from vessel's Starlink. Will be hard to upload logs for now. Work and wait.

YI - Iraq

IZ5WPZ, Antonio, is now in Baghdad, Iraq and QRV as YI9WPZ until August 2024. He has an IC-7300 running 400 watts into a 20 meter long wire antenna with a 9:1 balun. Activity will be on SSB, CW and FT8 on all HF bands. QSOs will be uploaded to LoTW, Club Log and HRDlog or via IK2DUW.

9X - Rwanda

DF2WO, Harold, is scheduled to be back in Rwanda May 2nd until May 17. While there he will be operating as 9X2AW on CW and SSB and possibly on FT8 on 80 through 6 meters.


June is SEMDXA officer election month. Just thought I'd mention that.







SOLAR ECLIPSE SHIFTED TIME SIGNALS IN USA

The US National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) has a radio station in Fort Collins, Colorado. Call letters: WWV. Operating at multiple shortwave frequencies, WWV broadcasts precise time and frequency information 24/7 to listeners worldwide. On April 8, 2024, the frequency of WWV shifted:

"It was the solar eclipse," says ham radio operator Kristina Collins (W8EDU) of Cleveland, Ohio, who assembled records from 13 monitoring stations in and around the path of totality. "The HamSCI Personal Space Weather Station Network's Grape stations measure Doppler shift in the carrier signal of time standard radio stations such as WWV. On April 8th, the network saw a distinct S-curve signature associated with the eclipse."

The Doppler shift occurred when the shadow of the Moon pierced the ionosphere, creating a temporary hole where ionization was reduced. This, in turn, altered the "skip distance" from transmitters to receivers, as shown in the diagram below:



This plot also contains data from WWV's sister station in Hawaii, WWVH

Because the skip point was moving, reflected radio signals were naturally Doppler-shifted. Spaceweather.com reader and senior physicist Larry Carr of Brookhaven National Labs made this calculation: "Using the 10 MHz WWV frequency, an average shift of about 1/2 Hz implies the layer bottom (the 'skip point') was moving at speeds up to 15 m/s. During the entire eclipse, the reflecting layer moved on the order of 50 km." The total Doppler shift was only a few cycles per second, similar to normal night-day variations, so no one actually lost track of time during the eclipse. Nevertheless, it is a fascinating demonstration of an eclipse's power to touch the Earth.
